Different Worship Styles to Engage Hearts & Minds:

We are a congregation and community filled with people of diverse needs whose hearts and minds are drawn to worship God and explore our faith in a variety of ways. For the summer, we have one service at 10 am that is 'blended' in nature - combining elements of traditional and modern music. During the school year, we have two distinct styles of worship. Both services include a central focus on preaching God's Word. Our 9:30 am service is less formal in style, including more of a spontaneous worship time with singing led by a worship band and song leaders, and is more diverse in form from week to week. Our 11 am service has liturgical elements of worship, hymns as well as praise choruses, a choir/special music, and has a formal feel. Our goal is always to honor God through our worship and help draw all people into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ.

Stewardship and Giving

Did you know there are several ways to give financially at LFPPC?

- The first is by putting a check or cash in the offering plates that are passed each week as part of our worship service. If you prefer a bit more privacy, envelopes are also available in the pew racks. Giving envelopes, stamped with a weekly date as a reminder, and with your own giving number, can be assigned from the office as well.
- Should you miss church, you can stop by the office during the week to drop off your donation, or mail it through the US Postal Service.
- If you plan to give the same amount each month, why not utilize the automatic withdrawal service available? Forms to get started are available in the church office and can be picked up, or one can be sent to you.
- Families who use on-line checking can list the church right along with their other bills and financial commitments, to have donations sent by your bank (at no charge).
